

Global Leadership Bootcamp with a Technology Focus

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Location:

Arusha, Tanzania

Duration:

4–12 July 2026 – 8 days in person

A specialized, experiential, and transformative training program

This 10-day leadership bootcamp offers a unique opportunity to explore and develop your personal leadership style through cultural immersion, reflective nature experiences, and cutting-edge AI tools.

Taking place in Arusha, Tanzania — a hub where modern innovation meets rich tradition and wild nature — the program invites students to question their assumptions, broaden their worldview, and connect deeply with themselves.

Participants will work alongside Tanzanian students, meet real leaders from diverse sectors, go on a guided coaching safari to reflect through nature, and discover how artificial intelligence can be used as a tool for personal growth. More than just learning about leadership — this course is about becoming a leader, from the inside out.

This program is carried out in collaboration with <u>Habari Maalum College</u>, a respected Tanzanian institution that enriches the experience through local insight, academic exchange, and cultural integration.



Before traveling: preparation and connection

3 preliminary virtual sessions with the international group:

- Connection between participants and facilitators
- Introduction to the challenge and the territorial ecosystem
- Theoretical capsules on systemic innovation, collaborative leadership, and the ethical use of Al
- Logistical and emotional preparation for an intense collective experience

Bootcamp Objectives

- Discover and develop an authentic personal leadership style.
- Combine European theory and Tanzanian practice to offer a global perspective on leadership.
- Foster personal growth through cultural exchange, reflection, and connection with nature.
- Apply artificial intelligence as a tool for self-awareness and personal development.
- Promote active learning through volunteering and collaboration with local communities.
- Strengthen key skills such as selfawareness, empathy, resilience, and initiative.

- Recap workshop and session on leadership tools
- Excursion to a Maasai community
- · Dinner with a local leader

From Action to Personal Growth

- Final volunteer activity
- Presentation of learnings, outcomes, and next steps

Local Experiences and Final Celebration

Beyond being university students or young professionals, participants should bring a growth-oriented and open mindset. This program is designed for individuals who are curious about other cultures, eager to challenge their own perspectives, and ready to both give and receive in an intercultural exchange. A willingness to learn from nature, to reflect deeply, and to engage in personal development is essential. Participants should be open to stepping outside their comfort zone, value authentic connection with others, and see leadership as something rooted in self-awareness, empathy, and responsibility — not just position or status.
